#### Hello Autumn by Jo Lindley


Meet four magical friends who control the seasons. As Summer passes the weather crown to Autumn, a season of bright colours and fun-filled adventure awaits.

A fabulously funny tale of one squirrel's enormous surprise at the inevitable change of seasons. What is this white stuff on the ground? And why is it so cold?






# <u>ABC Animal Rhymes for you and Me by Giles</u> <u>Andreae</u>

# Three little Pigs by any version


Join the three little pigs as they set off to the world, build their houses and encounter the big, bad wolf.
