

World Book Day

We are celebrating World Book Day 2025 on Thursday 6 March.

"This year we are inviting everyone to **Read Your Way**. Our research shows that children feel reading is something they have to do, rather than something they choose to do.

Read Your Way encourages everyone to let go of reading pressures and expectations, and empowers children and young people to have fun discovering reading on their own terms."

Listed below are some ways you and your child can enjoy reading together:-

- Snuggle up and read bedtime stories
- Use different voices and sound effects when telling a story
- Make up stories to encourage imagination and conversation
- Listen to audio books
- Visit libraries together

HOUSEKEEPING

With the cold and wet snap that we're experiencing, please can we ask that your child comes to pre-school with suitable warm outdoor clothing as well as a spare set of clothes, including a pair of wellies. Please label clothing and footwear.

Children should not come to pre-school if they have a temperature. If they have vomited or had diarrhoea, they are allowed back to school 48 hours after their last episode. If prescribed antibiotics, we also ask that they are kept home for at least 24 hours to ensure that they do not react to them.

Whether on holiday or due to illness, please email or call in to report your child's absence.

We politely ask that the children's scooters or bikes are parked in the bike shed in the mornings and are not used in the playground whilst waiting to enter Ducklings.
